

"Gabo: The Creation of Gabriel Garcia Marquez" to screen at Film Space, Metropolitan State University, July 28, 7:30 PM, free admission.

Gabriel García Márquez grew up in the poverty of northern Colombia, dropped out of law school, became a globally celebrated author of many novels including "*Love in the Time of Cholera*" and "*One Hundred Years of Solitude*", and was awarded the 1982 Nobel Prize in Literature.

"Gabo: The Creation of Gabriel Garcia Marquez" is a thoughtful documentary about the life and legacy of Gabriel Garcia Marquez, directed by Justin Webster. It most recently won 'Best Documentary' at the 2016 Chicago Latino Film Festival.

This acclaimed film is a Minnesota premiere. It is part of the "Open Screen Film Series" at Film Space. It is presented by the Intergarción Cultural Colombiana en Minnesota, the Colombian Foreign Ministry, and Metropolitan State University.
